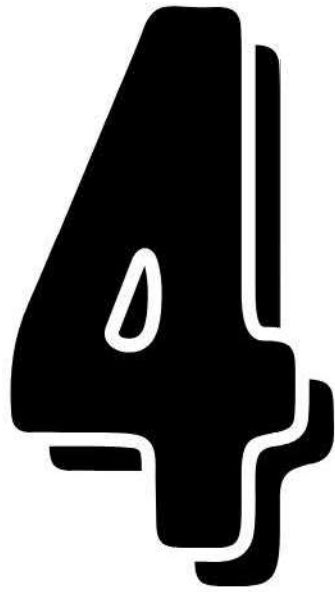
MEASLES

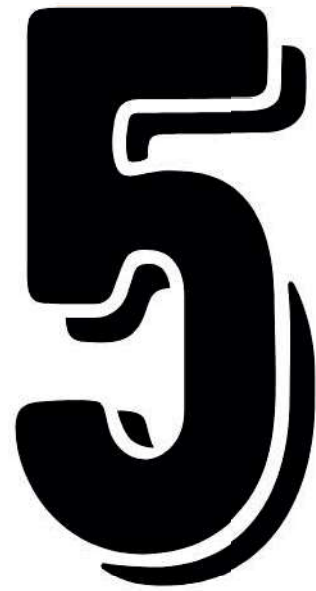

THE COST OF GETTING SICK IS TOO DAMN HIGH

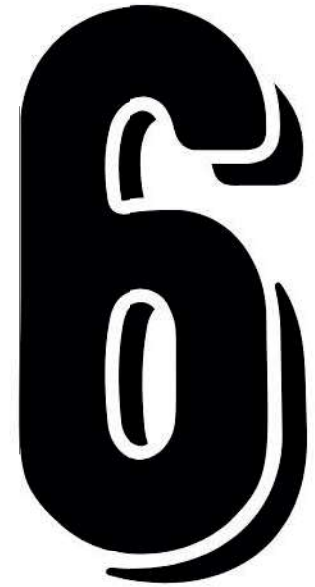

PROTECTING BABIES & KIDS

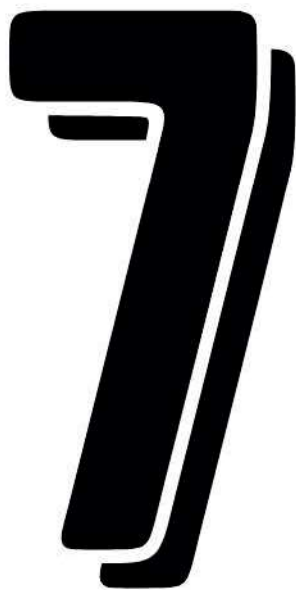

SOLIDARITY WITH IMMUNO- COMPROMISED & DISABLED PEOPLE



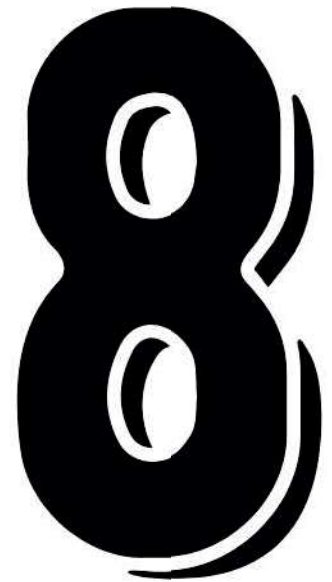

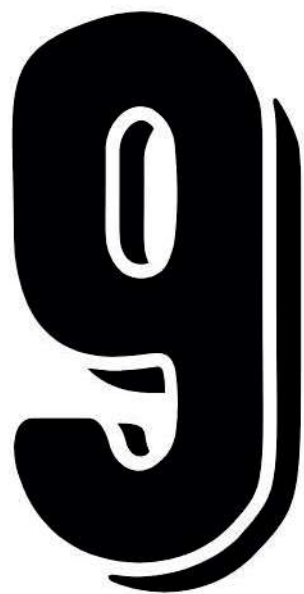
REJECTING THE IDEA THAT DISABLED PEOPLE ARE DISPOSABLE

Biden's "let it rip" Covid strategy meant that disabled and immunocompromised people were left to fend for themselves, showing how careless our society is towards people who are seen as sick or weak. My disabled friends are so precious to me. It angers me that policies in the U.S. are still based on eugenics, favoring some bodies over others. Wearing a mask is one small way to push back on that ideology.

GIVING OTHERS THE COURAGE TO WEAR MASKS



When I see other people in a confined space who are wearing a mask, I breathe a little easier. Likewise, when I wear a mask, it becomes that much easier for other people to wear one too. It normalizes the idea that wearing a mask is something people do and there's no need to stare or comment on it.



MITIGATING THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE

In the past few years, we've been dealing with unprecedented smoke from massive wildfires. Exposure to smoke particles has the potential to cause long-term cardiovascular and respiratory effects. If it's hazy outside or the AQI (Air Quality Index) is over 100, I'm sure as hell gonna protect my lungs with a mask.

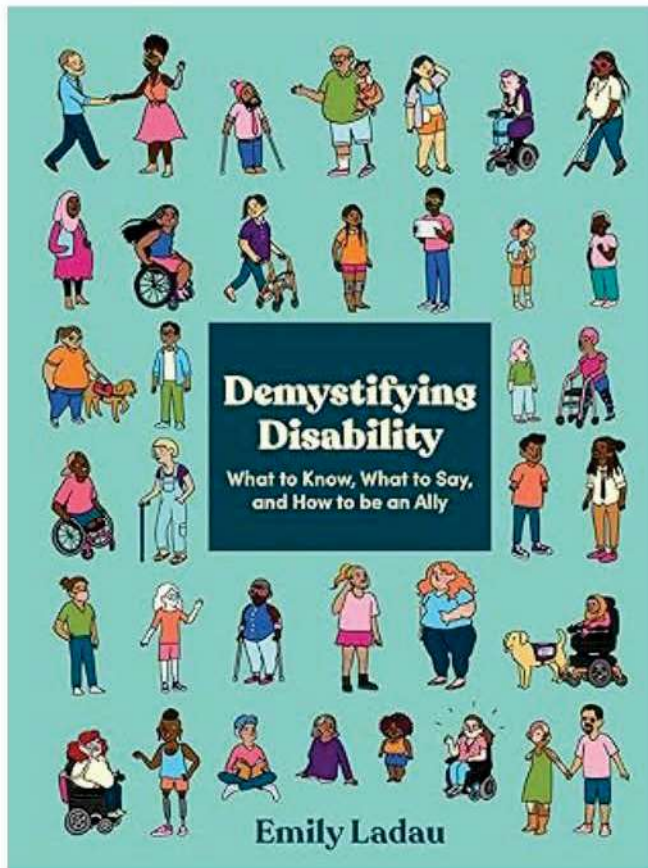
